
II. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

X. Rights under Copyright

- ► Moral rights
 - Right of authorship
 - Right of integrity
 - Inalienable rights
- ► Economic rights
 - To reproduce the work in any material form
 - To issue copies of the work
 - To perform the work in public
 - To make any translation or adaptation of the work
 - To sell or give on hire

XI. Advantages of copyright registration

- Public record created
- Can sue if infringed
- Term of copyright -
 - Literary, artistic works Life + 60 years
 - Cinematographic films, sound recording 60 years from the date of publication

XII. PATENTS

What is a patent?

Patent is a monopoly right granted by the State to exclude others from exploiting or using a particular invention. This exclusive monopoly granted by a Patent is provided in return for the inventor disclosing the details of the invention to the public.

Term of a Patent – 20 years





XIII. Conditions of Patentability

- Novelty If there in the Prior Art No Patent
- Non-obvious If obvious to a person with ordinary skill in the art No Patent
- Industrial application/utility

XIV. Inventions not PATENTABLE (Section 3)

- a. Frivolous;
- b. Contrary to public order or morality;
- c. The mere discovery of A scientific principle;
- d. Mere discovery of any new property or new use of an existing substance
- e. Mere admixture
- f. The mere arrangement or re-arrangement or duplication
- g. A method of agriculture or horticulture
- h. Any process for the medicinal, surgical, curative, prophylactic diagnostic, therapeutic;
- i. Plants and animals in whole or any part thereof other than micro organisms but including seeds, varieties and species and essentially biological processes for production or propagation of plants and animals;
- j. A mathematical or business method
- k. A literary, dramatic, musical or artistic work or any other aesthetic creation whatsoever including cinematographic works and television productions;
- A mere scheme or rule or method of performing mental act or method of playing game;
- m. A presentation of information;
- n. An invention which in effect, is traditional
- o. An invention relating to atomic energy



XV. Compulsory Licenses

- After the expiration of three years -
 - (a) reasonable requirements not met with
 - (b) not available at a reasonably affordable price
 - (c) not worked in the territory of India

XVII. INDUSTRIAL DESIGNS

- Features of shape, configuration, pattern or ornaments.
- Three-dimensional features, such as the shape or configuration of an article, or of
- Two-dimensional features, such as patterns or ornaments.
- Term 10 years initially +5 years renewable

XVIII. Conditions of Design Registration

- New or original
- Not disclosed to the public
- Significantly distinguishable from known designs
- Not scandalous or obscene
- Not contrary to public order or morality



XIX. TRADEMARK

- Word
- Device
- Label
- · Letters or numerals or any combination thereof.
- Combination of colors
- Shape of goods or their packaging
- Marks constituting a 3- dimensional sign applied to articles of commerce
- ► Nature Territorial; Term 10 years and can be renewed indefinitely

XX. Kinds of Trademarks

- Marks on goods (Brand names)
- Service marks (includes Trade names)
- Certification trademark ISO, ISI, AGMARK
- Collective marks CA, ADVOCATE, DOCTOR, ENGINEER
- Well known marks (super brands)

XXI. Geographical Indications (GI)

- ► Term 10 years renewable indefinitely
